Through his diverse practice, Lisle has gained experience handling class actions, complex appeals, declaratory judgment actions, extraordinary writs, injunctions, and original jurisdiction cases.

In addition to practicing, Lisle enjoys teaching Election Law at the University of South Carolina School of Law. He is a member of the Advisory Board of the NMR&S Center on Professionalism, and he also serves as Vice President of the South Carolina Chapter of the Federal Bar Association, State Chair for the American Bar Association Council of Appellate Lawyers, and Co-Chair of the Appellate Subcommittee of the South Carolina Bar's Judicial Qualifications Committee.
